Use strong passwords

Strong passwords make it harder for scammers to hack your online banking or email accounts. For tips to protect your information online, see the Australian Cyber Security Centre website.

Secure your computer and mobile devices

Never give unsolicited callers or third parties remote access. Make sure your computer's antivirus software is up to date. These can help block scammers.

Password-protect all your devices. If you're using a shared or public computer, never save passwords and always log out of your accounts.

Shop on secure websites

Only shop on websites you trust and make sure the website is secure. The web address should show a closed padlock or key and start with 'https'. Avoid any arrangements with a stranger that asks for upfront payments via a money order, wire transfer or cash.

Shred your documents

Shred letters from your employer, bank or super fund before you throw them out to protect personal details.

Check the lender is licensed by ASIC

By law, all lenders must hold a credit licence from ASIC. You can check if a lender is licensed on the ASIC website.
